           She lost her little smile (inaudible) and started to bite

           and pull out large chunks of her hair. (Inaudible) was
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           covered with bald patches. She stopped talking and her
           understanding disappeared. She had a hearing test done
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under general anaesthetic and repeated several more times,
 from which I was told she had nerve damage to her hearing,
 and she was fitted with a hearing aid. Her hearing is now
 good after suffering many years from glue ear. I do
 remember she always wanted to be on my lap and looking back
 I think she was terrified.

8 Melissa had suddenly changed to become autistic. This was not something that came on slowly, or anything I would have 9 missed. She was not like this before the vaccine. She was 10 11 a totally different child. I could not get the doctors to listen to me, and one even called me an overanxious neurotic 1213 mother. Melissa was finally diagnosed as a severe autistic with severe learning difficulties and (inaudible) behaviour. 14 15 She was underweight for many years and is now still on a 16 lower weight for her age. She was later diagnosed with 17 lymphoid (inaudible) and severe constipation. She has (inaudible) in her bowel. She suffers from reflux. She has 18 19 severe (inaudible) and strange rashes which seem to occur at the same time as her bowel pain. She wears nappies at night. 20 My daughters health is deteriorating. She now has a 21 22 stomach ulcer. She is 13« years old and still in nappies and she is physically far stronger than I am when she in pain. 23 Her tummy is extremely swollen and (inaudible). She suffers 24 extreme bowel head and joint pain which is becoming more and 25

1 more frequent. When she is in pain she is terrifying to be 2 with. She will bite herself. She has a thick scar on her 3 hand from where she is biting it. You can see that in the 4 photograph.

6 She will take anyone in a fight. Kicking, scratching, 7 pulling hair and biting as hard as she can and she will not 8 let go. A few months ago she bit me 8 times in one attack 9 before she was pulled off me. I needed hospital treatment 10 and I will always have the scars on my arms.

She will also throw and break as many things as she can gethold of when she is like this.

My daughter can now speak. Mainly in single words and always (inaudible). When she is calmed down, she sobs to go to hospital or to see a doctor. It is so awful when a doctor cant or wont treat her. I cannot find any medication that Melissa can tolerate for her pain. I feel so helpless. I believe the MMR vaccine damaged Melissa. I was there. I watches her change. I saw what happened.

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23 Melissa does not have a future. Its just taken away from 24 her. She will always need 24 hour, 7 days a week, 1 to 1 25 care. She will not have a career. She will not get married

or have children. I hope that one day soon we can claim for
 it. (Inaudible)

Melissa deserves her right to have her case heard in court. 4 She deserves to have compensation to allow her to have a 5 б good quality of life. We need legal aid to do this. If there 7 were more strong evidence of MMR and autism in the near 8 future it would be unjust if her rights were taken away (inaudible) compensation for her suffering (inaudible). I 9 feel Melissa has been severely damaged by this vaccine. 10 Ι wish she could talk to you and tell you how she feels 11 (inaudible). She has suffered enough, and she is in agony. 12

And there is actually one more matter. Like the others, I 14 15 filled in for the Legal Services Commission, the reasons why 16 I felt that Melissa should continue to have Legal Aid. And 17 I was naturally surprised when we got the cancellation through. And I did phone them and (inaudible). And, I was 18 19 talking to a girl on the phone. And she said to me, she didnt really say much, and I said to her, did you look at 20 the cases as a whole, were the cases as a whole, did you 21 22 make a decision on the cases as a whole, because I knew that it was a group action. And she said yes. So I said, are you 23 saying that the weaker cases dragged my daughters down with 24 25 them, because my daughter is a strong case, Ive been told

1		that, and she said yes.
2		
3		So I then decided to write in to ask the reasons why
4		Melissas legal aid was dropped, and also how they had come
5	1	to this decision. I have yet to hear from that, so I phoned
6		up, and left a message. Somebody very senior from the Legal
7		Services Commission phoned me back and in the course of the
8		conversation, he said that the decision to stop the Legal
9		Aid came from above. Now I said to him, what did you mean by
10		above. He said (inaudible) that the decision to stop Legal
11		Aid came from the Government He actually said that. It was
12		not. Why would I make that up. I have no need to make that
13		up. He said that to me. And I was not mistaken because I
14		asked him what he meant. I just feel that that should be
15	1	down on record.
16		
17		I would also like an inquiry, an investigation, whatever it
18		is, that needs to go on. If that is the case, that is very
19		very serious. We dont stand a chance if that is the case. We
20		dont stand a chance. These children dont stand a chance.

22		LORD JUSTICE KEITH: And is your position, Mrs
23		Wilkins, the same as the others?
